A Look at Trinity University's History in the NCAA Playoffs

1994

The Tigers finished the regular season with a 10-0 record for the first time in school history – the only previous year the team went undefeated was in 1954 with a 9-0 mark – qualifying for its first Division III playoff appearance. Trinity hosted Washington & Jefferson in that first round game, but its inexperience resulted in a 28-0 win by W&J – which is also the last time the team has been shut out.

1997

After a two-year hiatus, Trinity was back in the NCAA playoffs, and back in San Antonio for a first-round game. Trinity defeated Catholic 44-33 in that game, scoring the final 20 points to erase a nine-point deficit in the second half. Mike Burton threw for 274 yards and three scores, while Mark Byarlay rushed for 172 yards and a pair of touchdowns. In the second round, Trinity traveled to Pennsylvania to take on Lycoming College. The Tigers fell behind 26-0 and never recovered, losing 46-26 despite 12 catches and 153 yards from Andre Boldware.

1998

Trinity opened up at home in the postseason for the third straight time, facing Western Maryland College. The Tigers moved on to the second round for the second straight season on the strength of a 20-point third quarter, winning by a 30-20 final score. Mike Burton had one of the best individual performances in school history with 506 yards and four touchdowns through the air. Canaan Factor had seven catches for 194 yards and a pair of scores. The second round was a

rematch at Lycoming, but the result would be drastically different as Trinity jumped out early and held on for a 37-21 win. Damond Garza rushed for over 100 yards, while Burton threw two more TD passes. The win sent the Tigers to their first-ever appearance in the semifinals, which was rewarded with a matchup against Division III power Mount Union. Trinity took a 22-21 lead early in the fourth to erase a 21-2 lead by the Purple Raiders, but Mount Union prevailed in Alliance, Ohio, by the final of 34-29.

1999

The Tigers received a first-round bye after finishing 10-0 in the regular season, then took on Western Maryland for the second straight season. After Trinity took the early lead, the Green Terror came back with two straight scores in the third quarter to go ahead 16-13. Jeremy Boyce returned the ensuing kickoff 79 yards for a touchdown to put Trinity on top for good, though, sending the team to the quarterfinals against Hardin-Simmons. Trinity built a 30-10 halftime lead, then held on for 40-33 win and a second consecutive berth in the semifinals. Mike Burton threw for 389 yards and three touchdowns, with Bo Edwards catching eight passes for 156 yards and a score. In the semifinals against Pacific Lutheran, the Tigers fell behind 28-6 late in the first half at home, but came back with two scores in the final three minutes to make it 28-21. The Lutes were too much for the Tigers in the end, though, winning 49-28 to eliminate Trinity from the postseason. Mike Burton had 437 passing yards and four touchdowns in the loss, which was his final game with the Tigers.

2000

Trinity opened the postseason in a cold and foggy day at home against Wesley College in 2000, and won 21-3 despite only nine first downs by the Tigers. Matt Milligan scored two touchdowns, while Jeremy Boyce broke a 71-yard run to open the second half of play. Trinity then faced Bridgewater in the second round, and the teams put up 1,100 yards of offense combined. The Tigers came out ahead with a 47-41 overtime victory, sealing the win with a fumble recovery by the defense. Milligan scored three touchdowns in the game, and QB Roy Hampton threw for 503 yards and three scores. Travis Munro finished with 13 receptions for 173 yards, and Jason Hunt had 10 catches for 199 yards and a pair of scores. In the quarterfinals, Trinity and Hardin-Simmons were locked in a rematch – this time in Abilene, Texas. The Tigers missed two field goals and an extra point, falling 33-30 to the Cowboys after failing to score from the five yard line in the final seconds.

2001

The Tigers opened the postseason with a first-round game against Mary Hardin-Baylor, winning by the final of 30-6 in what would become an all-too-familiar first round matchup. Jeremy Boyce ran for 136 yards as Trinity never looked back after opening the first quarter with a pair of touchdowns. The next game would be a rematch with Bridgewater, but would be in Virginia this time. The Eagles defeated the Tigers, handing them their earliest exit in the playoffs since 1997. Trinity lost 41-37 in the game when Bridgewater scored a go-ahead touchdown with 34 seconds remaining. That came after a 36-yard Todd Canion field goal put the Tigers ahead 37-34 with just 67 seconds to play. Roy Hampton had 426 yards and three touchdowns, while Boyce topped the 100-yard mark again. Jason Hunt and Jerheme Urban both had 11 receptions – Hunt finished with 140 yards and Urban had 99. Jacob Respondek had 137 yards receiving as well.

2002

Trinity opened the playoffs against Mary Hardin-Baylor for the second straight season, this time in a matchup of two teams ranked in the top five nationally. Rudy Meza returned the opening kickoff 81 yards for a touchdown that set the tone for the day. The Tigers held off a late rally by UMHB to take a 48-38 win. Roy Hampton had 341 yards passing and five total touchdowns (four passing). Three Tiger players had over 100 yards receiving with Jason Hunt leading the way with 150 yards. Jerheme Urban and Jacob Respondek each had two touchdown grabs. In the second round, Trinity would host Washington & Jefferson in a rematch of the 1994 season – Trinity's first in the playoffs. The Tigers put up an amazing 648 yards of total offense, including 141 rushing yards from Jeremy Boyce, to take an easy 45-10 win. The quarterfinals would be another rematch, this time at Bridgewater – the third straight season these teams would meet. The Tigers led most of the game, but it was two scores less than three minutes into the fourth quarter that sealed the 38-32 win. Trinity put up over 600 yards for the second straight game, led by 481 passing yards and four touchdowns by Hampton. Urban had nine grabs for 173 yards and three touchdowns, while Hunt finished with 10 catches for 132 yards. In the semifinals, Trinity returned home to host perennial power St. John's University. After building a 34-13 lead at the half, Trinity had to hold on for a wild 41-34 victory. The Tigers scored with 2:18 to play to take the lead for good. Boyce had 150 yards rushing and a touchdown, while Urban had

two touchdowns – including a 91-yard kickoff return. Hampton threw for 171 yards and a score, as well as rushing for 89 yards and two touchdowns in the game. The win set up a third rematch, this time in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl – the Division III National Championship – against Mount Union. Trinity lost 48-7 in that game, with Boyce rushing for 93 yards and Dan DesPlaines throwing the team's only touchdown from 18 yards out to B.J. Smith.

2003

Trinity traveled to East Texas Baptist for the first round of the playoffs, marking the first time that the team had to travel in the opening round of postseason play. The game would go down as one of the most dramatic in school history. Trinity led 13-7 at the half, but East Texas scored 21 points in the third to take a 28-13 lead. Trinity then scored 19 unanswered points in the fourth to take a 32-28 lead that was erased by a quick strike touchdown from 80 yards out by East Texas with less than two minutes to play. Trinity drove down for a game-tying field goal by Todd Canion with 57 seconds left to force overtime. East Texas scored on five plays in overtime, which was answered three plays later by Trinity. Unfortunately, the extra point was blocked, which bounced Trinity from the first round of the playoffs for the first time since 1994. Dan DesPlaines finished with 353 yards

passing and five touchdowns, while Robert Kelner had seven catches for 101 yards and three scores. Daniel Lacroix finished with 130 yards receiving and 45 yards rushing for Trinity.

2004

The Tigers renewed their postseason rivalry with Mary Hardin-Baylor, but it would be the visiting Crusaders that would prevail this year. Trinity took an early 6-0 lead, but UMHB scored with six seconds to play in the half to take a 12-6 lead after two quarters. After another Crusader score in the third, Trinity cut it to 18-13 with their own touchdown, but UMHB scored twice in the fourth quarter to put the game away. Robert Kelner and Derek Boles both went over 100 yards receiving in the game.

2005

Trinity faced UMHB for the fourth time in the past five postseasons, and the Crusaders would even the playoff series with its second straight win. The Tigers struck first – just as they had a year ago – but UMHB roared back in the second quarter with 28 points, including two interception returns for touchdowns. The game was 35-6 in favor of UMHB, and neither team had more than 200 yards of offense.

Head Coach Steve Mohr

STEVE MOHR begins his 18th season as head coach of the Trinity football team this fall, having posted an impressive 136-52 record over his first 17 campaigns. He has established himself as the winningest coach in school history, in both total victories (136) and winning percentage (.723).

Coach Mohr has also served on the NCAA Division III National Football Committee each of the past two years, and will continue in that role during the upcoming season. Last year, the Trinity Tigers reign of thirteen consecutive SCAC Championships and nine straight trips to the NCAA playoffs ended with a second place conference



finish at 5 – 1 record and an overall mark of 8 – 2.

Under his guidance, the Tigers have produced a 126-22 record over the past thirteen years, an .851 winning percentage, which is ranked second among Division III schools during that span.

In 2002, the Tigers advanced to the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, the Division III National Championship game in Salem, Virginia.

Respected by his peers, Coach Mohr has been named the SCAC Coach of the Year nine times in his career. He has received four GTE Regional Coach of the Year Awards, as selected by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

Coach Mohr is a two-time Division III National Coach of the Year, including receiving the honor in 2002 from the Football Gazette. In 1998, Coach Mohr was named the Division III National Coach of the Year by the American Football Gazette, as well as by CBSsportsline.com.

Prior to joining the Trinity staff, Coach Mohr was an assistant varsity football and head junior varsity baseball coach at Ithaca College in New York from 1985 – 1989. While at Ithaca, the Bombers reached the Division III football semifinals three times, finishing as National Champions in 1988 and runners-up in 1985.



Before coaching at Ithaca, Mohr served as an assistant varsity football coach and head baseball coach at the University of Findlay in Ohio from 1976 - 1984. the University of Findlay captured the NAIA Division II football title in 1979 and were runners-up in 1978.

Coach Mohr earned his bachelor's degree from Denison University in 1976 and a master's from Bowling Green State University in 1977. As a student-athlete at Denison, Coach Mohr lettered in baseball, basketball, football and golf.

#21 Trinity 23 - 0 East Texas Baptist
Ornealas Stadium, Marshall, TX

Trinity's football team opened the 2007 season with a 23-0 shutout win at East Texas Baptist University on Saturday afternoon. Trinity, which shut out East Texas Baptist 41-0 last year, forced two turnovers and allowed only 10 first downs and just 142 yards of total offense in the game.

The Tiger defense forced two turnovers and gave up just 46 yards rushing in the game. Lee Patterson's interception led to Trinity's second touchdown in the third quarter, and put the team ahead 16-0. Brian Marynowitz gave the defense a chance for the shutout by recovering a fumble in his own end zone, keeping East Texas from taking an early lead in the game. Dylan Nealous led the team in tackles with eight total, while Shaun Irchirl and Philip Kownslar both finished with six stops.

Offensively, despite a slow start, the Tigers put up 358 total yards – including 270 yards through the air. All of that yardage was attributed to senior quarterback Blake Barmore, who completed 18-32 passes and connected for two touchdowns. Last year's leading receiver, junior Riley Curry, caught three passes for 67 yards, but it was new starter Chris Coleman who led the team on Saturday. Coleman had five receptions for 88 yards and a touchdown – including two catches over 35 yards.

Chris Baer, who suffered a season-ending injury against East Texas Baptist last season, made his return in style, scoring two touchdowns (one rushing, one receiving) and totaling 39 yards of offense.

Trinity makes its home debut this week against Texas Lutheran University. Last year, the Bulldogs defeated the Tigers 14-9 in the second week. The game snapped Trinity's six-game win streak against TLU, dating back to the 2000 season. The victory was the first for TLU since 1977.

Player of the Week (Offense):

Chris Coleman...JR...WR...5-10...182...Lampasas, Texas (Lampasas HS)

Coleman caught five passes for 88 yards and a touchdown on Saturday, helping lead the Trinity football team to a 23-0 season-opening victory over East Texas Baptist University.

Coleman, who had just two career receptions (both in 2006) prior to this game, also caught a 30-yard scoring pass against ETBU last season – his first career touchdown. This past Saturday was the first career start for Coleman.

Player of the Week (Defense):

Lee Patterson...SR...DB...6-0...193...Garland, Texas (Lakeview Centennial)

Patterson, one of the team captains this season, recorded four tackles – three solo – and an interception to lead Trinity to a 23-0 shutout in the season opener against East Texas Baptist on Saturday.

After Trinity scored on its first possession of the third quarter, ETBU took over with a chance to answer that score and get back in the game. On the second play of the drive, Patterson picked off a pass at the 36 yard line, returning it to the 23, and setting the Tiger offense up for a score that would put his team up 16-0 halfway through the period.

Last season, Patterson was sixth on the team with 43 tackles, and though he recovered a fumble, he did not have an interception. His interception on Saturday was the fourth pick of his career.

#19 Trinity 31 - 10 Texas Lutheran
E.M. Stevens Stadium, San Antonio, TX

The Tiger football team won its home opener by the score of 31-10 over Texas Lutheran University on Saturday night, erasing the bad memories of last year's loss to the Bulldogs.

Trinity enjoyed three touchdowns from sophomore running back Chris Baer, who has now scored five times in the first two games. Also finding the end zone was Caleb Urban, younger brother of Trinity football and track & field standout Jerheme Urban. The younger Urban opened the day's scoring with a 24-yard reception in the first quarter.

The Tiger defense forced multiple turnovers for the second straight week to start the season, recording two interceptions and a fumble against Texas Lutheran. In the second half, the defense gave up zero points, forced three turnovers, blocked a field goal, and caused TLU to turn the ball over twice more on downs.

Brian Marynowitz picked off both passes, and also led the team with 12 tackles. Lee Patterson finished with 10 tackles to join Marynowitz in double figures.

Blake Barmore completed 17-26 passes for a career-high 280 yards and a touchdown, with six of those completions going to Chris Coleman. Coleman finished with six receptions for 111 yards – his first career 100-yard game.

The Tigers racked up 372 yards of total offense, giving up 273 yards to the Bulldogs. Just 91 of those yards were through the air, though, marking the second straight game the defense has not allowed a team to throw for 100 yards.

Player of the Week (Offense): Blake Barmore...SR...QB

Barmore recorded his fifth 200-yard passing game in leading Trinity to a 31-10 victory over Texas Lutheran University on Saturday night.

Barmore hit 17-26 passing for 280 yards and a touchdown against the Bulldogs, setting a new career-high for the second straight week. Last week, he broke his personal record with 270 yards in the season opener, but eclipsed that with Saturday's effort.

Barmore has also thrown a touchdown in seven consecutive games, dating back to last year. He has thrown at least one TD pass in 11 of 15 games from his sophomore year on, and only time he didn't throw for a score last year was in a game that he left early due to injury – week two at Texas Lutheran.

Player of the Week (Defense): Brian Marynowitz...SR...DB

Marynowitz led the Tiger defense to a 31-10 victory over Texas Lutheran on Saturday night, opening the home schedule with a victory.

Not only did Marynowitz lead Trinity with 12 tackles in the game, but he also picked off two second-half passes. His second interception came late in the fourth quarter to seal the victory and keep the Bulldogs off the scoreboard in the second half.

After giving up 10 points in the first half, Marynowitz and the defense gave up no points in the final two quarters, forcing three turnovers and blocking a field goal attempt.

#15 Trinity 38 - 13 Colorado College
E.M. Stevens Stadium, San Antonio, TX

The Tiger football team opened up SCAC play with a 38-13 victory over Colorado College on Saturday night at E.M. Stevens Stadium.

It was the first meeting in 10 years between the two teams, but the first ever in SCAC play. The win also gave Trinity a 12-11 edge in the all-time series. The 38 points is tied for the second-most points scored by Trinity in the series.

Blake Barmore completed 17-27 passes for 209 yards and a career-high four touchdowns in the game, leading the Tiger offense to its highest totals in yardage and points this season.

Shawn Thompson caught seven passes for 85 yards and a touchdown to lead Trinity's receivers. Eight different players caught passes in the game, with seven of those catching multiple passes. Greg Bielski led the team in rushing with 72 yards on just eight carries.

Defensively, Philip Kownslar led the team with 13 tackles in the game, Dylan Nealous had eight total tackles in the game, including 2.5 for loss and a sack for a loss of 14 yards. Nealous also intercepted a pass on the third play from scrimmage, setting up Trinity's first score with just one minute elapsed in the game.

Trinity's defense allowed less than 100 yards passing for the third straight game, and allowed less than 100 yards of offense in the second half.

The Tigers will face SCAC newcomer Birmingham-Southern College for the first time in school history next weekend.

Player of the Week (Offense): Blake Barmore...SR...QB

Barmore completed 17-27 passes for 209 yards and a career-high four touchdowns on Saturday, leading Trinity to a 38-13 victory in the team's 2007 SCAC opener.

Barmore led the Tiger offense to its best game of the year offensively, racking up 452 yards overall. The yardage and points scored are the highest this season. The team also scored 30 or more points in consecutive games for the first time since the 2005 season.

Each game this year, Barmore has improved his QB efficiency rating, which includes Saturday's 176.87 rating against Colorado College.

For the season, Barmore has completed 52-85 passes (61.2 %) for 759 yards and seven touchdowns, throwing just two interceptions. He is averaging better than 250 yards/game through the air and has a QB rating of 158.65 on the season.

Player of the Week (Defense): Dylan Nealous...SR...LB

Nealous recorded eight total tackles for the Tiger defense, leading the team to a 38-13 victory over Colorado College.

Of his eight stops, 2.5 tackles were for a loss – including a 14-yard sack in the second quarter. That sack pushed Colorado College out of field goal range, forcing the visitors to go for it on fourth and long, and resulting in a turnover on downs.

Nealous also had an interception on the third play from scrimmage, returning the pick 20 yards to set up first and goal for the Trinity offense early in the game. The Tigers scored on the next play, making it 7-0 after just one minute of action on Saturday.

For the season, Nealous is third on the team with 22 total tackles overall. He has 4.0 tackles for loss, and Saturday's sack was his first of the season. The interecption was also his first this year, and the fifth of his career. Nealous also leads the team with four pass breakups – one of which came against Colorado College.

#14 Trinity 44 - 14 Birmingham Southern
E.M. Stevens Stadium, San Antonio, TX

Trinity's football team hammered out a 44-14 win over Birmingham-Southern College on Saturday, remaining unbeaten through the first four games of the season.

Trinity topped 500 yards of total offense in the game and scored 40 points for the first time this season. The Tigers have scored 30 or more points in three straight games for the first time since 2004.

Blake Barmore continued to shine for Trinity, completing 22-27 passes for a career-high 285 yards and one touchdown. Saturday marked the third time this season that Barmore has set a new career-high in passing yards. Barmore also broke the school record for completion percentage (minimum of 20 completions) in the game.

Peter Licalzi tied a school record by kicking three field goals – all of which came in the first half. Licalzi also had five extra points to give him a team-best 14 points scored on the day. The last Tiger player to kick three field goals in one game was Todd Canion in 2002.

Greg Bielski rushed for 103 yards on Saturday, becoming Trinity's first 100-yard rusher since Jerrold Jones rushed for 215 yards against Redlands in 2004. Bielski's 73-yard run for a touchdown was tied for the sixth-longest rush in school history.

The Tiger defense gave up just one yard rushing in the game, recording five sacks and 11 tackles for loss in the game. Chris Jones and David Morgan combined for 12 total tackles and 5.0 tackles for 22 yards lost in the game.

Trinity will travel to Memphis, Tennessee, this weekend to take on Rhodes College in continued SCAC action. The Tigers are 14-10 all-time against the Lynx, having won three straight and 13 of the last 14 games.

Player of the Week (Offense):

Blake Barmore...SR...QB...6-3...213...Friendswood, Texas (Friendswood HS)

Barmore completed 22-27 for 285 yards and a touchdown, leading Trinity to a 44-14 win over Birmingham-Southern on Saturday afternoon.

Barmore broke the school record for completion percentage (minimum 20 completions) with his 81.5% rate against the Panthers. The 285 yards through the air also sets a new career-high for Barmore, marking the third time this season that he has bested his previous personal best.

For the season, Barmore has completed 74-112 passes (66.1%) for 1,044 yards and eight touchdowns, throwing just two interceptions, and posting an impressive 164.37 QB efficiency rating.

Player of the Week (Defense):

Chris Jones...SR...LB...6-0...208...Houston, Texas (Klein Collins HS)

Jones tallied a team-best seven tackles in leading the Trinity defense to a 44-14 win over Birmingham-Southern College on Saturday.

Jones and the Tiger defense allowed just one yard rushing in the game, recording five sacks and 11 tackles for loss. Jones had two sacks for a loss of 11 yards himself, playing in his second game this season.

For the season, Jones is fifth on the team with 16 total tackles, with Saturday's sacks being the first of his season. Jones has played in two of the team's four games, making his eight tackles/game good for second on the team.

#12 Trinity 13 - 27 Rhodes College
E.M. Stevens Stadium, San Antonio, TX

The Tiger football team, ranked in 12th in two separate Division III polls and in the top 20 in a third, was stunned in a 27-13 loss at Rhodes last Saturday. Trinity had won 11 of its last 12 games coming into Saturday.

Trinity held a 10-3 lead at halftime after scoring 10 unanswered points in the second quarter, but the hometown Rhodes Lynx held the Tiger offense to just three second half points. Rhodes scored 21 points in the fourth quarter, and also became the first team to score in the third quarter against Trinity, hitting a field goal that cut the lead to 10-6 at the time.

Blake Barmore completed 22-37 for 282 yards and a touchdown, but the Trinity offense committed five turnovers that kept them from putting together a possible comeback. Barmore also ran eight times for 48 yards, but was sacked seven times in the game. Riley Curry finished with eight receptions for a season-high 114 yards in the game, while Caleb Urban caught his third touchdown of the season.

Trinity will take on DePauw University next Saturday in a clash of two of the top teams in the conference standings. Both teams have also already lost a game in SCAC play, so both are faced with a must-win situation this week.

Trinity is 8-0 all-time against DePauw, since the Indiana Tigers joined the SCAC in 1998. Each of the past four meetings have been decided by 11 points or less – including a 29-28 Trinity win in 2004 and a 26-24 game in 2003. The 2003 game was the last matchup between these two teams in Greencastle, Indiana.

Player of the Week (Offense):
Riley Curry...JR...WR...6-0...187...Sugar Land, Texas (Clements HS)

Curry caught eight passes for the second week in a row on Saturday, as Trinity fell at Rhodes 27-13.

Curry finished with eight receptions for a season-best 114 yards against Rhodes, extending his streak to 15 consecutive games in which he has caught two or more passes. The game also marked the second 100-yard receiving day of his career.

For the season, Curry leads the team 26 catches for 377 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He is averaging 75.4 yards/game and 15.4 yards/reception through the first five games.

Player of the Week (Defense):
Baron Koch...SR...DL...6-1...228...Austin, Texas (Westwood HS)

Koch finished with four tackles and an eight-yard sack in which he forced a fumble to help lead the Tiger defense in a loss to Rhodes last weekend.

Koch is seventh on the team with 17 total tackles on the season, leading all players with 7.0 tackles for a loss of 26 yards. He also has 1.5 sacks for a loss of 10 yards and Saturday's forced fumble was his first this year.

#23 Trinity 43 - 28 DePauw
Blackstock Stadium, Greencastle, IN

Trinity's football team rebounded from last week's upset loss at Rhodes with a 43-28 victory at DePauw on Saturday. The margin of victory was the largest in this series since 2001, breaking a streak of four straight games decided by 11 points or fewer.

Quarterback Blake Barmore led the team with 518 yards of total offense, breaking the Trinity and SCAC single game record in the process. Roy Hampton's 513 yards against Bridgewater in 2002 was the previous mark.

Barmore completed 22-32 passes for 476 yards and two touchdowns, which is the fourth-most passing yards in a game in school history. He also ran for 42 total yards and two more scores to account for four of the team's six touchdowns.

Trinity took a 19-0 lead midway through the second quarter, but DePauw cut it to a five-point advantage after returning a fumble 54 yards as time expired. Trinity opened the second half with 17 unanswered points to put the game away.

Three different Trinity receivers finished with over 100 yards in the game, led by Riley Curry's 10 receptions for 167 yards and two touchdowns. The 10 catches ties his career high and the 167 yards are the most in his career.

Trinity's offense tallied over 600 yards in the game, which is the highest total since the team had over 700 against Redlands in 2004. Defensively, Trinity forced four turnovers for the first time this season.

Trinity will host Sewanee in the team's only home game of October this weekend. Trinity has won 14 consecutive games in the series, and holds an overall record of 16-4 against Sewanee. Each of the past two games have been decided by 14 points, and Sewanee has been held to 14 points or less eight times in the last nine meetings.

Player of the Week (Offense):
Blake Barmore...SR...QB...6-3...215...Friendswood, Texas (Friendswood HS)

Barmore enjoyed the best game of his career – and one of the top performances in school history – in a must-win on the road against DePauw University on Saturday, leading the team to a 43-28 victory.

Barmore finished with a school and SCAC record 518 yards of total offense in the game, including 476 yards passing – the fourth-highest total in school history. Barmore completed 22-32 passes and threw two touchdowns, also rushing for 42 yards and two scores. He accounted for four of the team's six touchdowns.

For the season, Barmore has completed 118-181 (65.2%) through the air for 1,802 yards and 11 touchdowns. He is averaging 300.3 yards/game passing and holds an efficiency rating of 164.46 on the year. The two rushing touchdowns this week were the first of the season for the senior quarterback.

Player of the Week (Defense):
Shaun Irchirl...SR...DB...5-7...182...Humble, Texas (Humble HS)

Irchirl helped lead Trinity to a crucial 43-28 win over DePauw University last Saturday, accounting for five tackles and three turnovers in the game.

Irchirl had five solo tackles for the Tigers, also recording two pass breakups and forcing a fumble. Additionally, Irchirl picked off two passes in the red zone to end a pair of DePauw drives.

Irchirl's first interception came at the five yard line, and led to a Trinity touchdown in the second quarter that put the team up 19-0. His second pick came in the fourth quarter, and kept DePauw from cutting into the lead midway through the quarter. Irchirl grabbed this one in the end zone, forcing a touchback.

For the season, Irchirl is sixth on the team with 23 tackles, and is tied for second with 17 solo stops. He leads the team with eight pass breakups this year, and the forced fumble and two interceptions this week were his first this season.

#21 Trinity 42 - 7 Sewanee
EM Stevens Stadium, San Antonio, TX

Trinity's football team won its only home game in the month of October, beating Sewanee 42-7 on Saturday afternoon, and improving to 6-1 this season.

After stalling on its first drive of the game, Trinity's offense got on track in a big way, scoring on four straight possessions to take a 28-0 halftime lead. Defensively, the Tigers gave up just 43 yards in the first two quarters, forcing Sewanee to go "three-and-out" six times in seven possessions.

Trinity piled up 461 yards of offense, while Sewanee finished with 218 total yards in the game. Sewanee committed the only turnover of the game – a third quarter fumble that led to Trinity's final score.

Tiger quarterback Blake Barmore was 20-28 for 220 yards and three touchdowns before he was relieved in the third quarter. Backup Bryant Wilson completed 6-8 passes for 34 yards and a touchdown – his first of the season and second of his career.

Wideout Chris Coleman finished with a career-high seven catches and 127 yards receiving, while Shawn Thompson had five receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns. Riley Curry caught at least two passes for the 17th straight game to start his career at Trinity, finishing with three for 25 yards.

This weekend, Trinity will make its return to Jackson, Mississippi for a highly-anticipated matchup between the Tigers and the Millsaps Majors. The game will be a clash of top 25 teams as the Majors have moved into 24th in the latest D3football.com national poll.

Last season, Millsaps won 34-12 in a winner-take-all game to end the regular season. The win snapped Trinity's 13-year run of SCAC Championships, as well as its nine-year streak of playoff appearances. Millsaps leads with a 16-14 record since this series began in 1974.

Player of the Week (Offense):

Chris Coleman...JR...WR...5-10...182...Lampasas, Texas (Lampasas HS)

Coleman led the Tigers to a 42-7 victory over the University of the South-Sewanee last weekend, setting new career high marks in receiving in the process.

Coleman caught a career-high seven passes for 127 yards and a touchdown in this game, leading the Tiger receivers. His 127 receiving yards is also a new career high, marking his second 100-yard game of the season.

Each of Coleman's seven receptions were for first downs in this game, and at the end of the first quarter, he accounted for all 49 yards of Trinity's second scoring drive. He caught a 38-yard pass to start the offensive series, then caught an 11-yard touchdown to put Trinity on top 14-0.

For the season, Coleman is second on the team with 28 receptions for 486 yards and two touchdowns. He is averaging 17.4 yards/reception and 69.4 receiving yards/game this season.

Player of the Week (Defense):

Dylan Nealous...SR...LB...5-11...221...San Antonio, Texas (Madison HS)

Nealous led the Tiger defense to 42-7 victory over Sewanee on Saturday, posting its best defensive effort since a season-opening shutout.

Nealous finished with eight tackles in the game, securing Trinity's only two sacks for a loss of 12 yards. The seven points and 218 yards allowed by Nealous and his defensive teammates were the fewest since giving up zero points and 142 yards to East Texas Baptist in week one.

For the season, Nealous is second on the team with 41 tackles and 6.5 sacks for a total loss of 34 yards. His 3.0 sacks are tied for the team lead, and he is also second on the team with four pass breakups – not to mention being one of four players with an interception this year.

#19 Trinity 28 - 24 #24 Millsaps
Harper Davis Field, Jackson, MS

Trinity's football team scored on the final play of the game to beat Millsaps 28-24 on Saturday afternoon, but it was the way in which it scored that was truly amazing.

After failing on a two-point conversion that would have tied the game at 24-24 with just over two minutes left in the game, and failing to recover the ensuing onside kick, it looked like Millsaps would beat Trinity for the second straight season. That win would have also clinched the SCAC Championship and automatic bid to the NCAA playoffs for the Majors, but it was not to be.

Out of timeouts, Trinity was unable to stop the clock on the first three plays of the final possession for Millsaps, and with eight seconds left, the Majors called for timeout. Hoping to run out the clock and end the game, Millsaps ran a play on fourth down, but two seconds still remained after the change of possession.

The Tigers completed a pass over the middle, then lateraled the ball 15 times on its way to an improbable, unbelievable, shocking game-winning touchdown by wide receiver Riley Curry. Curry actually touched the ball four times during the play, and on the fourth, he scampered into the end zone.

It was the second touchdown of the game for Curry, who caught the 13-yard pass from Blake Barmore that cut the lead to two in the fourth quarter. Curry finished with nine receptions for 115 yards. Chris Coleman had his second straight 100-yard day, totaling 119 yards on eight catches for the Tigers.

In a game that was expected to be a battle of two of the nation's top quarterbacks, Barmore and Millsaps signal-caller Juan Joseph were overshadowed by the play of the defenses. Barmore did finish with 339 yards and two scores on 27-43 passing, but he threw a pair of interceptions. Joseph was 24-45 for 227 yards and three touchdowns, but threw three picks and fumbled once.

Both defenses forced four turnovers in the game, and Trinity's defense kept Millsaps from scoring on four of its seven red zone opportunities. Dylan Nealous led Trinity with 10 tackles in the game, picking up two for a loss, and recovering Joseph's fumble. Safeties Brian Marynowitz and Lee Patterson each had interceptions, as did defensive lineman Ryan Johnson on a screen pass by Joseph.

Trinity also got its running game going in this game, thanks in large part to a 121-yard effort from sophomore Chris Baer. Baer carried the ball 20 times for that total, scoring the team's first touchdown of the night in the first quarter.

With the win, combined with Rhodes losing 27-0 at Centre today, Trinity now controls its own destiny for the SCAC title and a trip to the NCAA playoffs. In order

to make that postseason appearance, the team must still defeat Centre at home next week, then win at Austin College on November 10.

Player of the Week (Offense):

STEPHEN ARNOLD, BLAKE BARMORE, RILEY CURRY, JOSH HOOTEN, BRANDON MADDUX, SHAWN THOMPSON AND MICHAEL TOMLIN - ALL OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY - have been named the SCAC Football Offensive Players-of-the-Week for their collective effort in Saturday's 28-24 victory over Millsaps College.

If you have figured it out yet, these seven are the ones who handled the ball during the "Mississippi Miracle" - the incredible 15-lateral, 60-yard circus act that Trinity executed to perfection to defeat Millsaps on the final play of the game in Saturday's battle for SCAC supremacy in Jackson.

Trailing 24-22 with two seconds remaining and the ball at his own 40-yard line, Barmore began the play with an innocent 20-yard completion across the middle to Thompson.

But then, as fireworks were launched and the clock turned to 0:00, Thompson began the sequence of laterals to Riley Curry. From there it went from Curry to Josh Hooten (an offensive lineman) to Michael Tomlin to Stephen Arnold (another offensive lineman) to Thompson to Brandon Maddux to Curry to Maddux to Barmore to Thompson to Curry to Tomlin to Hooten to Maddux to Curry, who rumbled the final 44 yards for the inexplicable score.

In the course of the play, Trinity initially advanced to Millsaps' 42-yard line, then retreated to its 45, advanced to Millsaps' 41, went back to its 42, moved ahead to Millsaps' 29 before moving back to the 44 and then scoring from there.

The play has been nominated as one of four Pontiac Game Changing Performances on ESPN.

EM Stevens Stadium, San Antonio, TX

The Tigers put themselves in position to clinch the 2007 SCAC Championship with a 34-6 win over Centre this past weekend. A win in the regular season finale at Austin College will clinch a co-championship with Millsaps, and Trinity will advance to the NCAA postseason.

Trinity's offense got off to a slow start with just three points in the opening quarter, but the Tigers scored on their first three drives of the second quarter to take a 20-6 lead. In the fourth quarter, Trinity capped the scoring with a pair of scoring drives to put the game away at the end.

The defense allowed just 171 total yards in the game, including -10 yards rushing. The game marked the first time the Tigers allowed negative yards rushing since allowing minus eight yards to DePauw in 2000, and was the fewest yards allowed since holding Centre to -19 yards rushing in 1999.

The Tigers also forced three turnovers and recorded six sacks in the game. Lee Patterson recorded a pair of picks, while Philip Kownslar led the team with 11 tackles in the game. Jeff Carapetyan finished with 2.5 sacks to lead the defense.

Blake Barmore had his third 300-yard passing performance in the last four weeks, completing 27-45 for 309 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Chris Baer scored his team-leading 11th touchdown on the season, while Riley Curry scored on a 43-yard pass reception. Jonathan Plotnick and Matt Moorefield both scored rushing touchdowns.

Trinity continues one of the longest-running series in its history this weekend against Austin College, as the two teams will meet for the 72nd time overall. This series dates back to the 1904 season, with Trinity winning 38-0 in that initial meeting. The Tigers have won 10 straight over the 'Roos, which broke up a 12-game winning streak by Austin College that spanned from 1979-1993. Trinity leads the series with a 36-29-6 record.

Barmore completed 27-45 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns in a 34-6 win over Centre on Saturday afternoon.

Barmore had his third 300-yard performance in the past four games, as well as throwing two touchdowns to give him 14 straight games with a TD pass.

For the season, Barmore has completed 64.6% (192-297) of his passes for 2,670 yards and 18 touchdowns. His QB efficiency rating of 155.45 leads the SCAC, and his 296.7 passing yards/game is second in the league.

Player of the Week (Defense):

Lee Patterson...SR...DB...6-0...193...Garland, Texas (Lakeview Centennial HS)

Patterson led the Tiger defense with four tackles and a pair of interceptions in a 34-6 win over Centre College on Saturday afternoon.

Patterson's first pick ended Centre's first drive in the second half, keeping the Colonels from gaining any momentum to start the third quarter. His second came in the middle of the fourth quarter, leading to Trinity's final score.

#13 Trinity 41 - 13 Austin College
Jerry E. Apple Stadium, Sherman, TX

The Tiger football team finished off the regular season with a 41-13 road win over Austin College on Saturday, sending the team into the NCAA playoffs with the win.

Trinity earned the SCAC Championship – shared with Millsaps College – with the victory, as well as the league’s automatic bid to the postseason. The Tigers will face the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor for the fifth time since 2001 in the playoffs.

The Tigers jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead and never looked back in this game, totaling 461 yards of offense. Defensively, Trinity forced two turnovers to give them at least one turnover in every game this season.

Blake Barmore completed 20-30 passes for 271 yards and three touchdowns through three quarters of play. He hit eight different receivers in the game, but his favorite target was Riley Curry. Curry finished with eight receptions for 101 yards, giving him four 100-yard games in the last six contests for the Tigers.

Chris Baer scored twice in the game, carrying the ball 16 times for 81 yards and a score, and catching two passes for 23 yards and a touchdown. Baer leads the team with 13 total touchdowns this season.

Chris Jones and Dylan Nealous led the Tiger defense with nine tackles each, with Nealous also recovering a fumble in the game. Trinity yielded just 55 yards through the air in this game, which is the fourth time this season that the Tigers have held an opponent to fewer than 100 yards passing.

Trinity has won the SCAC 14 times in the last 15 years, advancing to the playoffs 10 times in 11 seasons. The Tigers advanced to the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl in 2002, but the team has lost three straight postseason games since then.

Barmore completed 20-30 passes for 271 yards and three touchdowns in Trinity’s 41-13 victory over Austin College last Saturday, clinching the SCAC Co-Championship and the league’s automatic bid to the NCAA playoffs.

Barmore played just three quarters of the game before giving way to backup QB Bryant Wilson. Barmore has completed at least 20 passes for seven straight games, and has thrown a touchdown pass in every game this season. He led the team to its fourth 40-point game of the season against Austin College.

For the season, Barmore has completed 64.8% (212-327) of his passes for 2,941 yards and 21 touchdowns. He holds an efficiency rating of 157.29 for the year, and is averaging 294.1 yards/game through the air.
